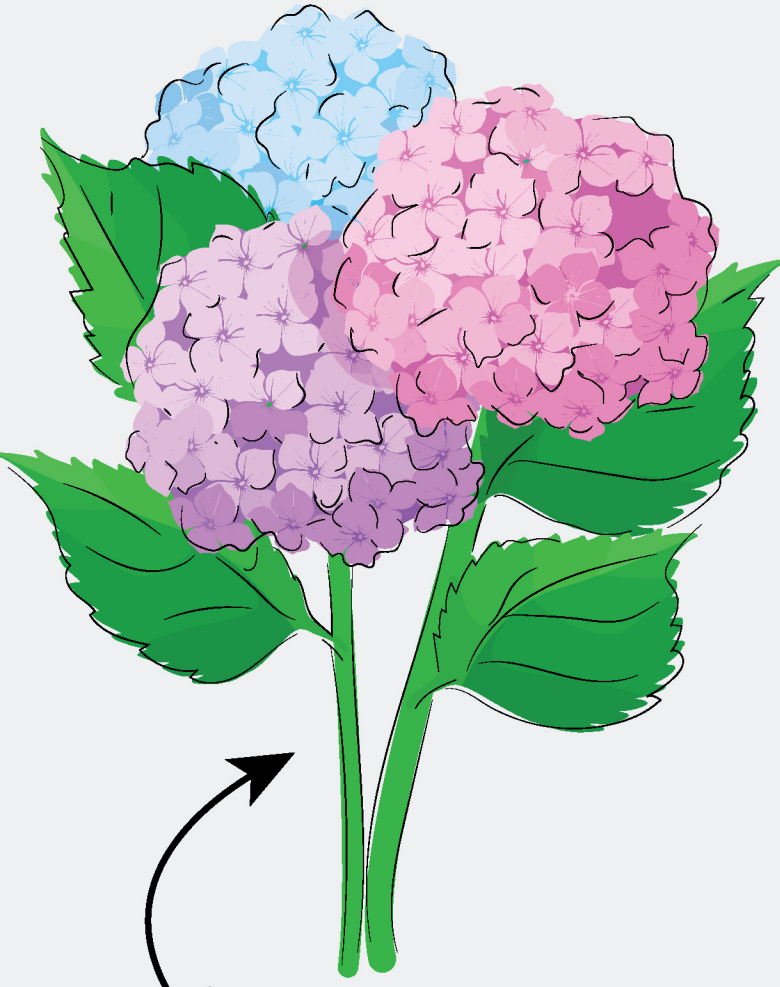

FRESH CUT FLOWER FEATURE *Hydrangea*

Hydrangea, also known as Hortensia, is not only beautiful, but an amazingly versatile mass flower offering texture and gorgeous color to any design.



SMALL FLOWERS SURROUNDED BY

ROUND CLUSTERS.

CARE TIP:

- Use Properly Mixed Flower Food
- Helps bracts fully expand
- Helps Hydrangea stay hydrated & avoid wilting
- Longer vase life & better color

DESIGN TIP:

Hydrangea performs best in vase arrangements. Be sure stems are well hydrated before designing. Use FloraLife® Finishing Touch spray when design is complete to keep blooms fresh.

Did you know the showy parts of the hydrangea flower are actually bracts which are more like leaves than petals? This is the reason Hydrangea flowers are so thirsty so it's vital to make sure they are kept hydrated with flower food.

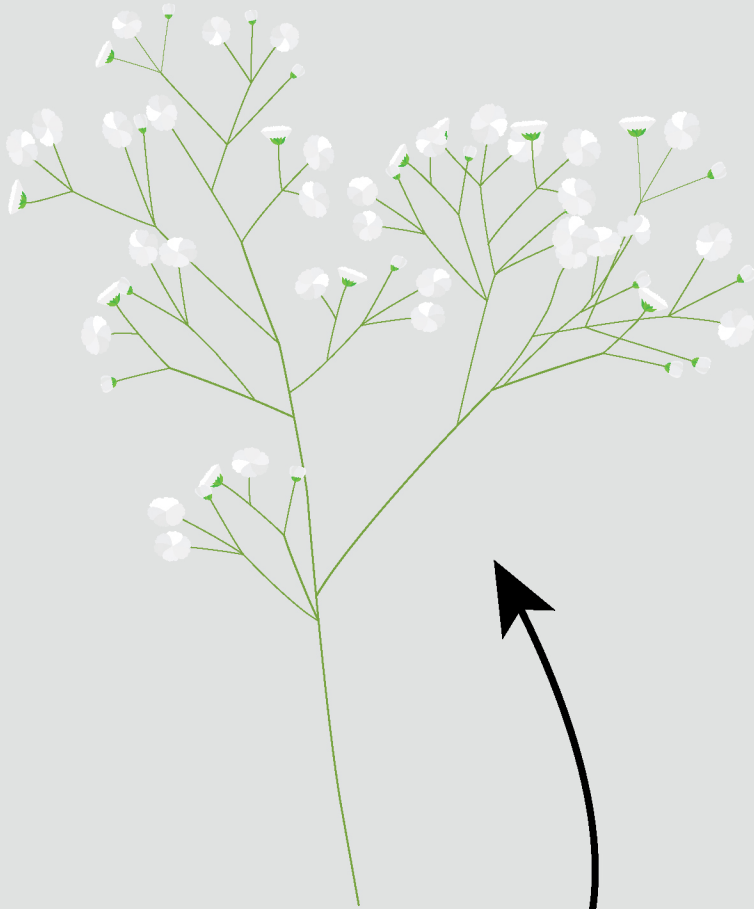

FRESH CUT FLOWER FEATURE *Gypsophila*

Gypsophila or Gyp, commonly known as Baby's Breath, is a filler flower used in design. Found in most coolers year-round, this tried-and-true staple item is available in many varieties in the market today.



TINY FLOWERS ON DELICATE
STEMS RESULT IN COMPLEX
MULTI-BRANCHING CLUSTERS
AT STEM ENDS.

CARE TIP:

Use Properly Mixed Flower Food to Ensure:

- Longer vase life & better color retention
- Aid in flower opening – closed buds will continue to ‘pop’ open

DESIGN TIP:

Cut stage is an important factor to consider in expected performance, ideally you will have 50% of the florets open when creating your designs, the other 50% to develop and open in the consumer's home.

JUST FOR FUN:

Did you know Gypsophila is related to Carnations? They are in the same family, Caryophyllaceae.
